

## **ASSIST COMMUNITIES THROUGH ALTERNATE AID PROJECT**

By implementing the **Alternate Aid Project (AAP)** communities have the ability to regenerate natural environments and community build while transforming globalisation into a values based economy.

### **What**

A culturally interchangeable blueprint for global socio-economics.

By encompassing artistic activities, self and project development and community building, highly ethical and passions based social entrepreneurial businesses can be developed and managed. Long term sustainability for improved local and global social and environmental challenges can be achieved.

### **How can AAP be implemented?**

**AAP** modules can be utilised using the simpler 'Project Spiral' resource alone, or can be integrated with the 'Project Spiral Activities List' for a more detailed understanding of social entrepreneurialism.

When implementing **AAP** internationally it is extremely important for all people involved in the design and delivery of the project to undertake initial and ongoing in-depth cultural integrations to understand local customs and traditions. This can be achieved through home stays, language training, relationship building, and attending local community gatherings and events.

Communities are offered demonstration workshops, usually with the assistance of a local partner organisation who can then implement the **AAP** program. Online contact between **AAP** implementers and the local organisation is continued to maintain evaluations and to offer required assistance, but generally the local community and local partner organisation remains independent to continue implementations unassisted, so that cultural customs and traditions are not changed by outside influences. arranged.

Schedules and project time frames can be arranged by the local community and partner organisation, and in-person visits for evaluations and follow-ups should occur each six to twelve months by the initial international implementers.

### **Example of module implementation:**

The daily schedule is an example of how **AAP** moduled can be delivered wholistically. (Note that times will alter between different communities).

The order of the Study Program Activities List (SPAL) can be implemented when the community and local partner organisation feel necessary. The following order however, is an ideal guideline for implementation, in which SPAL modules can begin to be delivered in part or fully.
